From the Director . . .

Thank you everyone for being so prompt with updating your paperwork. There are a few of you who are in need of updated wellness checkups, so just a reminder to make sure you are on top on that with your child(ren). There are Child Assessment forms to bring with you outside of my office, as well as online. I also had a few people need to update information on their emergency contact papers, so if you were one of them, please email me with the corrections.

As many of you have noticed, the travel restrictions in PA have been dropped and we will be following suit, though we will still be requiring that you inform us of your travels. That being said, I ask that everyone who is traveling to remain taking precautions while you are out. We are going on a year of this pandemic and we have been very fortunate that none of our kiddos or staff members have gotten COVID and we would like to keep it that way! Please help maintain the health and safety of our center!

Happy soon-to-be Spring! We will be having our annual Easter Egg Hunt on Wednesday, March 31st. We are still not letting parents attend these events, but we will take pictures and share them with you. A letter will be coming home very soon reminding you of this event and asking if you could donate 1 or more dozen plastic filled eggs. Please drop off the donated plastic filled eggs no later than Wednesday, March 24th so they may quarantine. Hopefully we will have great weather to have it outdoors.

I will be setting up a picture day sometime this spring, probably in late April. We have not had one in over a year and would like to try and do that if we can. I will be reaching out to the photographer, Jason, with "Through the Years

Photography". Jason is a local photographer and has been doing our pictures for several years now and he did them for us last fall before the pandemic. If anyone can capture a smile, it's Jason. A lot of the children know him already and are very comfortable with him. A few days, after pictures are taken, you will be given an envelope with directions to view the pictures on the website. You may order them online and have them sent directly to your home, or you may order using the envelope and have them sent here to the center. We will have Jason set up in a room that we do not use in the center so that we may sanitize it before and after. I will be sending out a permission slip for you to sign if you are comfortable with this and would like your child's picture taken. Do not feel obligated to have your child get their picture taken. I know we are still in the pandemic, but we will be taking all the necessary precautions. If you have any questions, feel free to ask me or your child's teacher.

They are trying so hard every day to do more and more by themselves. We have been changing out toys to support them in their attempts. All the kids enjoy being on the floor for the bulk of the day to practice, practice, practice! Using gentle hands is a concept we will be reinforcing for months to come.



Please get very serious about baby proofing your home. The curiosity combined with new mobility can lead to trouble in a hurry. You put your child on the floor and the next thing you know they are across the room! Keep your kid safe from your stuff and your stuff safe from your kid! Tape down electrical cords, put away knick knacks, lower the crib mattress all the way down and keep the doors to other rooms closed or install baby gates. Please!!

Just a few words about lunch. Please offer as many different foods as possible. Don't shy away from textured or mixed foods. We don't want blossoming taste buds settling on just 3 or 4 items. This is the time to try everything. Please offer foods even if you don't like them. I know so many people that are afraid to try foods just because they never had it as a child. It can take 8 to 15 tries before a child really knows if they like a food or not! The most important thing is to offer well-cooked hard foods so they are soft enough to chew and do not become a choking hazard. This is true for fruits and vegetables. Doctors report that young children do not need juice. It is much better to eat the fruit. So far this group of friends love to eat!

Hopefully we will be able to start going outside in the afternoons as the days start to get warmer. Happy Spring to us all!

We have some reminders:

1. ALL of your child's belongings NEED to be LABELED this includes but is not limited to... bedding, extra clothes, winter gear including hats and gloves, bibs, eating utensils, lunch containers, sippy cups, fruit and yogurt pouches, bags of snacks such as cheese sticks and crackers, bags of diapers and wipes, diaper creams, etc.
2. All bedding should be brought to school in a pillow case or fabric bag NO PLASTIC
3. Winter weather gear may stay on your child's hook during the week but must GO HOME ON FRIDAYS
4. Starting at age 2 your child should be wearing a mask from the time they walk into the building in the morning until they get outside after pick up. Please encourage your little one to keep their mask on in the hallway especially at pick up.





Hello from the Prekindergarten room! One of our upcoming themes for March is Spring; maybe we'll be all done with snow by then! To quote a UPS driver I spoke with recently: "I like snow, but this is too much, even for me!" Our class will be actively looking for signs of spring every time we venture outside.

Recent birthdays in our room include Maddy, who turned 5 on February 5th, Max, whose special day is March 8th, and Finn, whose birthday is March 20th. Happy birthday, friends!

Valentine's Day was a fun celebration, in spite of the COVID changes that we implemented. Thanks to all for the cards, treats, and special gifts. All were much appreciated ! We will, of course, be having a similar party for St. Patrick's Day!

Several of you have asked about parent conferences, as you prepare to send your child to kindergarten in a few months. More information regarding conferences will be coming soon; as with most aspects of daily life, COVID precautions will alter conferences, too. Be sure to contact your school or district if you have any questions about timelines for getting paperwork in, COVID protocols, or any other concerns that you may have.

At home, help your child's readiness by continuing to expand their repertoire of self-help skills. Your child should be dressing his/her self, opening most food containers and packaging on their own, and making decisions such as choosing which shirt to wear or what piece of fruit to pack in their lunchbox. Mastering self-help skills promotes confidence and is a Pennsylvania Learning Standard for Early Childhood education.

Your children have been doing a wonderful job memorizing Bible verses! Also, an update on Bible stories (which are not the same as the memory verses): from Christmas until just after Easter, we switch from the Old Testament to learning about the life of Jesus and the early Church. Right now we are reading about Jesus's lessons that he taught and the miracles that he performed. After Easter we will return to the lessons and stories of the Old

Testament. Favorite recent stories include the story of the four men who lowered their friend who couldn't walk down through a hole in the ceiling so that the friend could meet Jesus, and the story of Jesus feeding 5000 people with a boy's small lunch.

I hope that you all enjoy preparing for spring, as I do! I can't wait to get flowering plants into the ground, open my home's windows to let in spring breezes, and of course for Major League baseball to begin. Have fun preparing Easter baskets and playing outside with your child(ren)!
