It is not necessary but very much appreciated when we get a few boxes of softer tissues for our seemingly always runny noses. MISS CATHY'S PRE-KINDERGARTEN

Happy May from Prek! We've been looking for signs of spring, and we found everything on the list that we made back in March. However, we're still talking about whacky spring weather. Over the last couple of weeks, we have experienced rain, fog, mist, humidity, cool temperatures,



hot days, a dust devil whirlwind, even snow! We have been having fun trying to be weather predictors, without much luck!

Thank you for coming in for parent conferences. There was 100% participation this year, which is great. Like most aspects of life these days, conferences were modified to allow for social distancing and separation from the hallway. I enjoyed the opportunity to speak with each of you!

COVID reminders: PLEASE be sure your child's mask fits properly. It should cover nose, mouth and chin with a tight, but comfortable, fit. Some children are spending a large portion of their day constantly pulling up too-large masks. Your child should also have 2-3 clean masks, stored in a ziplock bag, in their backpack at all times, in case a mask becomes dirty, the elastic fails, etc.

It is still okay to send in birthday treats! Treats must be factory or bakery sealed, not baked at home. Just ask if you're not sure! Also, please do not touch other children's backpacks to place party invitations or other items.

This month's focus as we get closer to kindergarten is self-regulation. Self-regulation includes adhering to rules, both at home and at school. No temper tantrums or whining allowed! It also means talking through a problem with a classmate, or alerting the teacher to the problem, rather than lashing out physically. Young children can understand the rule "use your words, not your hands!" to resolve conflict with siblings or peers.

Learning to wait is another component of self-regulation. For example, waiting to take a turn in a game or in line for the restroom, not interrupting adults until they are finished speaking, and being patient while snack is handed out. Self-regulation is a PA Learning Standard for Early Childhood.

Enjoy the lovely month of May! Get outside with your child to blow bubbles, swing, fly a kite, or throw a ball!
