From the Director . . .

Hello Families!

As summer winds down and cooler weather creeps in, we expect the usual increase in potential illnesses. While we understand you might recognize certain symptoms in your child as being minor or as being caused by something innocuous such as teething, allergies, or reaction to a vaccination, we must all remember that a fever is not the only indicator of illness. While symptoms may be minor, and we have all dealt with children who are not feeling their best, an ill child is detrimental to not only the health of our staff and students, but also to daily routines and objectives of our classrooms. Other aspects of illness, such as a child being more irritable or more sleepy than usual, can affect the dynamics of a classroom, as well as the workload placed on our teachers and their ability to provide a safe learning environment for the other members of the class. We recognize that our families have a variety of hurtles to jump when a child is ill and that different families have different means for coping with this. We just ask that everyone consider the community here when there is illness in your home.

As we observe National Fire Prevention Week (October 9th - 15th), Shiremanstown Fire Dept. will be bringing their truck over for the children to see up close on Thursday, October 13th. The teachers will also be discussing with the children how to prevent fires and what to do if they're in one. We will also be reviewing our Fire Evacuation plan with the children. If you do not have an evacuation plan at your home, now is a good time to make one and talk about where you would meet outside if anyone gets separated from the family. Is there a trustworthy neighbor your family can go to? What should you do if a pet is trapped? It's never too early to talk about fire safety with you children.

I am very excited for Halloween, as it's such a fun holiday to celebrate. We are going to hold our Halloween parade this year on Thursday, October 27th at 3pm and you are invited to come participate! The rain date will be Friday, October 28th at 3pm. If it rains both days, it will unfortunately be inside and parents will not be invited (but the kiddos still have a lot of fun). We will be sending out more information on the parade in the coming weeks, so keep your eyes open for that. Just a reminder that treats must be store-bought and prepackaged and little inedible favors are encouraged as well. We will also keep some of our other fall festivities going here at the center, including a hayride from Mr. Baer, date TBD.

We had another great picture day with Miss Gil at the end of September! I appreciated everyone's patience as we navigated the different pay format for the Fall photos than what we had experienced in the Spring. I feel confident in Miss Gil's abilities and am looking forward to seeing the photos of all of our little cuties! She has informed me that we can expect our orders within the next 2 weeks.

Happy fall from Prek! We have been talking about, and observing, signs of the season. We made a checklist and have been marking off each item as we experience it: leaves changing color, the start of football season, geese migrating south. We've also noticed seasonal changes NOT on our list, such as cooler weather, and the fact that it's dark outside sooner than it was in summer. We'll keep checking!

Thank you to all who "attended" Parent's Night via zoom. It was nice to see you, even through a screen! Hopefully the information presented was helpful to your family.

We are settling into our school year. So far, everyone has memorized every Bible verse presented (we're on "D" as I type this newsletter)! The children are also doing a great job remembering our Bible stories. Each week, there is a corresponding color sheet to help reinforce the story. Ask your child to tell you the story each week, and talk about it as a family.

We continue on the path to kindergarten, which means learning more self-help skills at home as well as at school. Prek children should be dressing and undressing themselves independently. Sometimes a garment has a tricky fastener; practice together until your child masters it! He or she will be proud of their accomplishment. It is not too early to start practicing with fall and winter jackets, gloves/mittens, scarves, and boots (unfortunately, winter weather will be here before we know it!). That way, your child will be prepared ahead of time. Note: children should be putting on their own shoes, but shoelace tying is a skill that is usually acquired around age $5 \frac{1}{2}$. Of course, you could try now and see how it goes!

Two reminders: first, please be sure your child has everything they need for lunch, which may include a fork, napkin, etc. Second, please be sure that the items in your child's bag of extra clothes are seasonally appropriate and of correct size. These children have definitely grown since spring!

I hope you're enjoying this beautiful weather as much as we are! Get outside with your child and take a walk, throw a football, or, soon enough, rake a pile of leaves and jump in!
